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Materials:

41

4 mm facetted beads (F) (16 + 2 (closure)) for a 6,5 inch bracelet)




size 11 seed beads (s)

Nylon thread (the facetted beads have sharp holes) and two needles

The closure bead:

- make a patch in even count peyote, 6 beads wide and 10 rows high (picture 1-4)
- close the first and last row like a zipper and go back again to strengthen the closure (picture 5 6)
- attach the first facetted bead (picture 7)
- go through the seed beads to the other side (picture 8)
- attach the second facetted bead (picture 9), bury the thread in the seed beads
- side view of the closure bead (picture 10)




The bracelet:

The first step is made with two needles. (That sounds worse than it is ②)

- 1. Go through a middle s of the closure bead until the closure bead is in the middle of the thread.
- 2. Go with both threads through 2 s, cross in a new s
- 3. Take 1 F and 2 s on one thread, on the other 1 F and 1 s cross in the second s of the first thread
- 4. Take 2 s on one thread, on the other 1 s cross in the second s of the first thread
- 5. Take 5 s on one thread, go through the second (same direction) again and take 2 s repeat with the other thread, just take only 1 s at the end cross in the last s of the first thread
- 6. Take 2 s on one thread, on the other 1 s cross in the second s of the first thread
- 7. Take 1 s, 1 F, 1 s on the first thread, on the other 1 s, 1 F cross in the last s of the first thread
- 8. Take 2 s on one thread, on the other 1 s cross in the second s of the first thread
- 9. Take 5 s on one thread, go through the second (same direction) again and take 2 s repeat with the other thread, just take only 1 s at the end cross in the last s of the first thread
- 10. Take 2 s on one thread, on the other 1 s cross in the second s of the first thread

Repeat step 3 to 10 until you nearly reached your desired length, end with a Step 7



The closure loop:


My loop is made with 19 seed beads – but not all size 11 have the same size. It is better to try so your closure bead fits *just* through the loop. Knot your threads and bury them in the beads.




The second step of the bracelet is made with one needle (happy again? ②):

- 1. Fasten a thread in the seed beads of the closure bead. Go through 3 s, 1 F, 3 s
- 2. Take 4 s, go through the vertical bead of the little cross
- 3. Take 4 s, go through the 3 s in front of the facetted beads
- 4. Take 8 s, go through the lower 3 s of the little cross
- 5. Take 8 s, go through the 3 s after the facetted beads

Repeat step 2 to 5 until you reach the end of the bracelet, knot and bury your thread.
