

## Materials:


4 mm facetted beads (F) (9) (I used 5 light blue and 4 purple.)

2 mm seed beads bronze (R) (18) Nylonthread (0,25 mm)

1. This: \*\sigma is the middle of the thread. Take 1 R, 1 F, 1 R to the left thread and 1 R, 1 F, 2 R, 1 F, 1 R to the right one. Cross in the last three beads:



2. Take 1 R, 1 F, 2 R, 1 F, 1 R to the red thread and cross with the blue one through the last three beads:



3. Take 1 R, 1 F, 1 R and cross through all of them:



4. Sideview of the first half of the bead, the upper three beads are the "equator beads":




5. Take 1 R, 1 F, 2 R, 1 F, 1 R and cross through the last three beads:



6. Rotate your bead until the next "equator bead" is looking towards you. With the thread that is going "down" to the finished half you are going through the next "equator beads" (R, F, R) and take 1 R, 1 F, 1 R. Then you are crossing through these new beads with the thread that is coming out of the upper point:



7. One thread goes through the next set of "equator beads" (R, F, R), the other one goes from above through the next set of diagonal beads. Knot the threads ( ) and your bead is finished.
